RE : PERMITS TO TAKE HORSES ONTO FORESHORE LAND

This permit is issued for the financial year to allow horses to be exercised on the foreshore and in the sea abutting the foreshore, within the Barunga West Council.

Subject to the following terms and conditions:

- (1) Permits are not transferrable.
- (2) A permit holder must, before leaving any foreshore area, ensure that any excrement from any horse under his/her control is completely removed from said area.
- (3) The holder of this permit shall not exercise any horse or allow any horse to be exercised on the foreshore or in the sea abutting the foreshore, so as to cause a nuisance or danger to any person.
- (4) The holder of this permit shall not gallop or allow to be galloped any horse on the foreshore or in the sea abutting the foreshore. A galloping horse is one which is being ridden in excess of a reasonable canter.
- (5) Permits must be available for inspection upon request by a Council Authorised Officer or police officer.
- (6) If the holder of this permit contravenes any provision of any By-Laws or said Permit, he or she shall be guilty of an offence and may:
 - (a) be required by Council to forfeit such permit for the remainder of the financial year, and
 - (b) be liable to any penalty prescribed by the By-Law.
