Red Lid – General household waste and garbage. Soft plastic, Nappies, Kitty litter, Food scraps, Rags and clothing, Aluminium foil, Broken glass crockery, Polystyrene foam, Bubble wrap, Crab and fish carcasses

Lime Green Lid – Organic garden waste. Lawn clippings, pruning, garden trimmings, garden organics

Yellow Lid – Recycling. Glass bottles and jars (cleaned), Aluminium steel cans, Aerosol cans (empty), Rigid plastic containers, Plastic drink bottles, Yoghurt containers, Detergent bottles (lids removed), Juice & milk containers (cleaned & flattened)

Green Lid – Paper and cardboard only. Newspapers, Cardboard boxes (flattened), Magazines, Brochures, Junk Mail, Paper, Envelopes, Egg Cartons, Phone books, Pizza boxes












What do the numbers & symbols on plastic mean?

Many of us have been tricked into using the triangular symbol with a number inside to identify what can be recycled. But, this symbol is **NOT** a recycling symbol. It is a plastics identification code used to tell manufacturers what type of plastic the item is made from.

WHAT PLASTICS CAN BE RECYCLED?

Any plastic container that is rigid can be recycled! A handy tip for deciding if the container is "rigid" is if it: holds its shape when crumpled, and/or would hold liquid.

Here's a quick guide to containers with the plastic code that **CAN** be placed in your recycling bin:

Symbol	Type of plastic	Types of containers	Accepted in your recycle bin?
 PET	Polyethylene Terephthalate PET	Carbonated soft drink bottles, detergent bottles.	
 HDPE	High Density Polyethylene HDPE	Milk and cream bottles, shampoo bottles, cleaning products.	
 PVC	Polyvinyl Chloride PVC	Clear cordial and juice bottles.	
 LDPE	Low Density Polyethylene LDPE	Squeeze bottles.	
 PP	Polypropylene PP	Ice cream containers and lids, plastic take away containers.	
 PS	Polystyrene PS	Yoghurt containers and margarine/ butter containers.
