## **DISTRICT MANAGER’S REPORT**

### 1. NRM Levy for 2007/08

At a recent CEO’s Forum, Councils were advised of the Government’s decision to reduce their contribution to NRM Board’s across the State, along with the Northern Yorke NRM increased program requiring the need to raise more funds through the levies charged on Council rates.

Attached to my report is a letter from the Northern Yorke NRM Board advising of the withdrawal of some Government funds. The increase in our Council area will see the original levy rise from \$15.50 to around \$50.00.

As part of a program by the Central Region of Local Government I have written to the Minister for Environment and Conservation expressing our strong concerns at the Government’s actions (copy attached). At this stage I have not had a response from the Minister.

Cr Rooney moved, Cr Weedon seconded,

*‘that the District Manager writes a letter to the Local NRM Board expressing concern at the increased level of noxious weeds on the roadsides within the Council area’*

### 2. Port Broughton Foreshore Toilets

Arrangements have been made for the renovation of the Port Broughton Foreshore Toilets. This work involves the laying of new non slip tiles on the floor and floor to ceiling tiles on the walls, new pans, hand basins, doors etc. The cost of the renovation is \$7500 under budget and will be done by Ron Dewolf and Anton O’Brien, with work commencing in early February 2006.

I will arrange for the painting of the eaves and fascias on the exterior walls to complement the works.

### 3. Port Broughton Community School Library

Prior to Christmas I was advised by the Department of Education and Children’s Services (DECS) that the power upgrade to the School would be \$180 – \$200,000 due to the need to upgrade the transformer to increase the power supply required at the School, including the Library. The original price I understood was in the vicinity of \$50,000.

DECS have asked Council if they would consider paying 50% of the cost of the power upgrade, to which I have objected. I advised that Council should pay a percentage of the upgrade to cater for the Library extensions, eg \$25-\$30,000.

At the time we agreed to get together in the New Year and to see if we can get some agreement to ensure that the project does proceed. Arrangements have been made to meet

with DECS on 25<sup>th</sup> January 2007. I have had a meeting with DOTARS on 16<sup>th</sup> January 2007 to give an update on the progress of the report, so that the Minister can be updated on the status of the proposed work.

4. Broadband Connection

I am please to advise that Broadband services are now available for the Port Broughton area as from 21<sup>st</sup> December 2006. Discussions with Telstra indicate a decision is to be made on the services being available in Bute by mid January. If the green light is given for Bute it is anticipated that they will be on line by the end of March 2007.

Arrangements have been made for the Council office at Port Broughton to be connected to Broadband on 11<sup>th</sup> January 2007 at a cost of approximately \$2500. At this stage I will defer a wireless broadband connection to the Bute office until after the decision of Telstra to proceed with the Bute broadband.

5. Fireworks Permit

I have received an application from Star Fireworks to hold a fireworks display at North Fisherman's Bay on 25<sup>th</sup> January 2007. As the event is to be held on coastal land under the care and control of Council, approval from Council as landowners is required. A copy of the application is attached.

I have discussed the application with our Regional Risk Manager and our Fire Prevention Officer who are both happy with the application and the event management strategy proposed by Star Fireworks, with a provision being that the event not proceed should it be a fire ban day or winds are in excess of 25kph.

Cr Schkabaryn moved, Cr Simmons seconded

*That Council grant approval for Star Fireworks to undertake a fireworks display on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> January 2007 at North Fisherman's Bay on coastal land in accordance with the details outlined in their application with the provisions that the display not proceed should there be a total fire ban or winds are in excess of 25kph.*

6. OHS & W Self Audit

I have reviewed the preliminary results of the recent OHS & W Self Audit of Council done recently, which is to be confirmed by the Local Government Association Workers Compensation Scheme.

The preliminary results show we have made an improvement on our results of the previous year, which is a credit to all that involved to ensure that Council maintain a level of safety for all its staff and visitors to Council's workplaces.

The improvement in our results reflects the commitment from staff that is required to ensure that we have a high standard of care.

I extend my appreciation and congratulations to those involved with OHS & W and for staff members for being aware of their requirement.

7. Training Day for Elected Members

A reminder is given to all members and senior staff of the training session for elected members to be held on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> February 2006 at Kadina.

A copy of the brief course outline is attached to the Agenda.

8. Manager - Finance and Administration

I am pleased to advise that Lawrence (Blue) Jolly commences work on 15<sup>th</sup> January 2007 and will be attending the Council meeting on 16<sup>th</sup> January 2007. Due to absence of staff on Annual Leave there will be no financial report for the meeting.

Blinds for the house to be occupied by Blue have been ordered and are due for delivery in late January. Prices are being obtained for outside awnings and will be available at the February meeting.

9. Local Government Association – Street Lighting Contract

The Local Government Association has advised of an arrangement with Trans Tasman Energy Group (TTEG) to look at Council's street lighting costs and to identify any possible savings. TTEG would receive 20% of any saving identified for a period of five years.

2. *In exercise of the power contained in Section 44 (2)(d) of the Local Government Act 1999 the powers and functions of the Council under the Consultancy Agreement with Trans Tasman Energy Group Pty Ltd are hereby delegated to (Lawrence "Blue" Jolly, Manager Finance & Administration, and to any person occupying the office of Manager Finance & Administration.*

### **4. COUNCIL DEVELOPMENT ASSESSMENT PANELs (CDAP) -Update**

#### Purpose - For information

To advise Council of its obligations under the amended Development Regulations.

Council has received the Minister's consent to the delegate all of it's powers and functions as a relevant authority to Council's authorised planning officer, for an initial period of six months.

In discussions held 21 December 2006 between Council's Manager Environmental Services and Planning SA officers for the Minister for Planning and Urban Development, it was revealed that it is the Minister's expectation that Council utilise the six month exemption to establish its own CDAP or to join a Regional DAP. It was made clear that there was no indication that the current six month extension would automatically roll over.

### **5. CERTIFIED COMPLETION OF THE SCHOOL BASED IMMUNISATION PROGRAM FOR 2006**

#### Purpose – For information only

To inform the Council of the completion of the 2006 School Based Immunisation and the associated Reporting.

DC Barunga West conduct of the School Based Immunisation Program was undertaken by Dr Neville Witford, in accordance with Councils three year Agreement with the Department of Health's SA Immunisation Coordination Unit (SAICU).

### **6. MOSQUITO CONTROL PROGRAM FOR 2006**

#### Purpose – For information only

To inform Council on the Mosquito control operations to date.

Council staff have been conducting ongoing identification and monitoring of mosquito breeding areas and Mosquito Control operations since September, further expanding the matrix of Mosquito control points on 20 December 2006. Existing Mosquito Control points in the Fishermans Bay South area have been re-fitted with new slow release control chemicals. Council staff have also undertaken the mosquito controls for the STEDS effluent ponds, and prepared and issued a

community information brochure, along with the *Fight the Bite* pamphlets and posters provided by the Dept Of Health.

Council is continuing to work with EPA Officers investigating the potential off target impacts of the new mosquito control system. The EPA has advised that they will be setting up monitoring systems around Fisherman's Bay.

Council receive **zero** complaints regarding mosquitos over the Christmas and New Years holidays period, compared to several dozen formal written and telephone complaints registered for the same period last year.

## **7. EPA PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO PT BROUGHTON STEDS LICENCE**

### Purpose - For information

To advise Council of the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) proposed amendments to the License for the Pt Broughton STED Scheme.

In brief, the EPAs proposed amendments to Council's license for the Pt Broughton STEDS, involve the addition of two conditions of the Licence.

The two new proposed conditions on the Licence will enable the EPA to impose or vary conditions of the Licence, at the time of the third anniversary of the Licence, or to remedy a breach of the licence. The two proposed conditions are considered a reasonable mechanism as the EPA will also be extending the licence from an annual licence to a five (5) year licence.

## **MANAGER WORKS REPORTS**

### 1. Waste Management

The following is provided for members' information in relation to Waste Management and the issues facing Council in the future. I can now advise that the Environmental Protection Agency has finished its consultation process and has now released the new Guidelines called "Environmental Management of Landfill Facilities" (Total document 102 pages). I have taken some extracts from the new guidelines, which are attached to this report. The aim is to give Council some insight into what will be required, and what we are working through. These guidelines are implementing change to the way that we dispose of our rubbish and in particular the facility that can be used for disposal. There is also a push towards recycling which in turn means a reduction of waste to landfill.

Reports to date from other Councils indicate that the costs for construction of complying cells can be in the hundreds of thousands of dollars. These costs seem prohibitive for this Council; subsequently we are looking at alternatives.

Wakefield Regional Council has initiated a number of meetings with adjoining and neighbouring Councils to discuss the possibility of using their dump facility at Everard. They have a large parcel of land at Everard, which they are investigating whether it is viable to use as a regional dump facility. For it to be viable they need others to use the facility to keep the costs at some sort of reasonable level. Attached to this report are minutes from the last meeting held at Balaklava.

### 2. Staff Leave

As has happened in the past works staff are taking some annual leave during this period. This year the amount of leave taken has been staggered with some staff returning earlier than others.

Cr Kerley - enquired about the cleanup of the Norfolk Pine Needles needing to be cleaned up along the Port Broughton foreshore after high winds over the Christmas period.

Cr Rooney – enquired as to the general poor condition of the South Hummocks mail track and when it was going to be repaired.

Cr Simmons – enquired as to the poor condition of the Hot Mix bitumen that was laid in front of McArdle’s trucking depot, and requested that the Manager – Works get in contact with the owner.

*That Council appoint a Development Sub Committee of Council, to consider any development issues not covered by the delegated authorities of Mark Marziale, and this Committee be comprised of four members from the Executive Committee being Crs. McDonald, Rooney, Burgess and Mayor Dolling.'*

(D/Managers Note: - I have arranged for our Environmental Health Officer to advise of the requirement for the vent pipe and the necessary work will be done. No allowance has been placed in the budget for a contribution to the Mundoora Community Progress Association).

*'that the Mundoora Community Progress Association be advised, that due to no allocation being made in the 2006/07 budget, that consideration be made to contribute \$5,000 to the Mundoora Progress Association Playground upgrade in 2007/08 and for the Association to provide Council with a detailed pricing for the above project prior to any further decision being made'*

## **GENERAL BUSINESS**

Cr Simmons

– enquired as to whether the watering exemptions for the Bute Oval had been addressed yet. *The District Manager advised that the Supervisor – Parks and Gardens had returned from leave and would address the matter.*

- asked if a Wheelie Bin could be put in place of the existing bin that had been removed across from the Bute Hotel.

#### Cr Kerley

- expressed disappointment to the recent works in erecting Sail Shades at the Port Broughton Cemetery at the expense of the existing Native Vegetation.

#### Cr McDonald

- advised of concerns about the visual effects of the cemetery row signage that has been erected at the Port Broughton Cemetery (*Manager - Works advised the signs have been erected to be compliant with OHW & S standards*)
- advised members of the withdrawal of the VacSwim programme to the Port Broughton area and suggested that the Progress Associations may be able to assist in preventing this from occurring in the future.

#### Cr Schkabaryn

- enquired as to the rules from SA Water in regards to the watering of the Foreshores. (*District Manger advised that they are watered on the set days in line with SA Water and the restrictions imposed in regards to odd and even watering days*)

#### Cr Ireland

- asked as to why a ratepayer on the Kadina – Alford Road couldn't have his rubbish collected via the Wheelie Bin System (District Manager advised the ratepayer was currently on the way home for the Garbage truck after it had been emptied at the Port Broughton site)
- asked to whether a Commercial ratepayer could have access to the Alford Dump for a set yearly fee. (District Manager was aware of this ratepayers request and that this access had been denied and the use of the Wheelie Bin pick up be utilised) The same ratepayer asked that a Locked Wheelie Bin be placed outside of his commercial residence (*District Manger asked that this request be formalised in written form.*)
- raised concerns of several Tickera residents as to the illegal dumping of rubbish at the BBQ area.

#### Cr Dolling

- enquired as to the progress of the repairs to the Seawall at Port Broughton. (*Manager – Works advised that an application for funding major works had been lodged.*)

- asked if a key to the Bute Works Depot be readily available (*due to OHW & S regulations to the access of unsupervised unauthorised people access would have to be supervised at all times*)

- enquired as to the whereabouts of the plaque missing at the Matthew Flinders Park Lookout.

Cr Smith

- asked if a piece could be included in the next Council Newsletter advising Ratepayers as to the reason why the Seaweed is only removed on the Fisherman's Bay Shore for the Sports Carnival at Easter and not at any other time.
- advised of general safety concerns of Bike Riders on reserve of the Kadina Road as well as the detrimental damage to the native vegetation.

Cr Smith moved, Cr Mc Donald seconded,

*'that the District Manger advises Transport SA in writing of the concerns of motor bike riders utilising the road reserve along the Pt Broughton – Kadina Road that is damaging vegetation and is a danger to adjoining land owners who are entering or leaving their property'*
